ISLAND CODE OF CONDUCT

RESPECT, PROTECT, ENJOY

By adhering to the island code of conduct you ensure that Lundy's wildlife remains protected for future generations.

- **Please do not drop litter.** Leave only footprints and dispose of all waste responsibly. Please pick up any litter you see and report pollution events to the warden.
- **Keep to obvious paths** and watch your step. Ground nesting birds may conceal nests within vegetation while seals pup on beaches. Remain vigilant and report any disturbance events to the warden.
- Never pick/damage wildflowers or fungi. Many species, such as the Lundy Cabbage or Golden Hair Lichen are rare and specially protected.
- **Enjoy wildlife responsible distance.** Please **do not feed** the wildlife, livestock or feral animals. If an animal appears agitated or aggressive towards you, please move away.
- The use of metal detectors or purposeful **ground disturbance is strictly prohibited**.
- **Keep Lundy rodent-free.** Please check your luggage for stowaways. Take all your waste home, especially perishables.
- **Collecting firewood or lighting campfires is strictly prohibited** anywhere on the island.
- Abide by the latest climbing and scrambling restrictions in place during the seabird breeding season. Please refer to the Climbing Restriction Guidelines, also enclosed in this book.
- The use of drones is not allowed. As a landowner, the National Trust does not permit unauthorised drone operation on its land and or properties. Permissions for research or commercial filming must be granted by the warden.
